Establishes the native Hawaiian recognition Act. Establishes the native Hawaiian role commission for the purpose of preparing and maintaining a roll of qualified native Hawaiians and certifying that the individuals meet the definition of qualified native Hawaiians. Requires the commission to appoint an interim council after the publication of the roll to organize a convention of qualified native Hawaiians to organize themselves. Requires the Hawaiian homes commission act, 1920 to be amended, subject to the approval of the US congress. Appropriation to the office of Hawaiian affairs. (\$\$) -- SB0001 SD2

Establishes provisions relating to free play not a defense; when. Free play shall not be considered a defense to an offense charged if the free play was offered by mail or electronic communication as an alternative to play via purchase of an item that is not bona fide or is offered at a price that is disproportionate to the value of the item purchased or a chance to win if the free play by mail or electronic communication is offered from a pool different from the pool from which the chance to win via purchase is drawn. -- SB0004 SD1

Repeals and replaces the board of education. Provides that the board shall consist of 9 members who shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate, plus 1 non voting member who shall be a public high school student. Requires the board to invite the senior military commander in Hawaii to appoint a nonvoting military representative. Repeals the election of the board of education. -- SB0008 HD2

RELATING TO THE BUDGET.

Establishes provisions relating to the reporting of intended material changes to capital improvement projects. Requires the director of finance to submit a report to the legislature that indicates the reasons for the material change. -- SB0020 SD1

SB0023 SD1 (SSCR 486)

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIANS.

Introduced by: Galuteria B (BR)

Establishes the 'aha kiole (aha kiole) commission within the department of land and natural resources to provide advisory input based upon the indigenous resource management practices of each moku to state and county agencies; aid in the implementation of a comprehensive set of best practices for natural resource management; foster the understanding and practical use of knowledge, including native Hawaiian methodology and expertise; ensure the future sustainable use of the State's marine, land, cultural, agricultural, and natural resources; enhance community education and cultural awareness; participate in the protection and preservation of the State's natural resources; engage in discussion with and participate in meetings and events held by the various moku statewide; establish an administrative structure that oversees the æaha moku (aha moku) system. Annual report to the legislature and governor. -- SB0023 SD1

RELATING TO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE FEES.

Introduced by: Baker R, Green J

Amends provisions relating to advance practice registered nurse; qualifications; recognition; endorsement; fees; eligibility. Requires the board of nursing to set appropriate fees for registered nurses and the center for nursing fee. Amends provisions relating to prescriptive authority for advanced practice registered nurses. Prohibits advanced practice registered nurse to be required to pay a fee relating to the grant of prescriptive authority. Amends provisions relating to renewal of license; denial, suspension, or revocation of license for default of student loan, student loan repayment contract, or scholarship contract; inactivation and reactivation of license; restoration of forfeited license. Requires each applicant to complete a survey developed by the Hawaii state center for nursing. -- SB0026 SD2

RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE.

Amends the accident and sickness insurance contracts law. Repeals long term care from accident and health insurance, or sickness insurance in a limited benefit health insurance policy. -- SB0027 SD1

RELATING TO ABANDONED VEHICLES.

Introduced by: Baker R

Amends provisions relating to notice to owner under the abandoned vehicles law. Extends the time that a legal and registered owner of an abandoned vehicle has to repossess the vehicle from 10 days to 20 days after mailing of the notice. Defines business days to exclude Saturdays, Sundays and state holidays. -- SB0030 SD1

Amends provisions relating to small claims. Provides that the tax appeals court shall not allow pretrial discovery and that the costs and fees awarded to the prevailing party shall be limited to fees paid directly to the court in the course of conducting the tax appeal at issue. -- SB0034 SD1

Amends provisions relating to procedures, protections, rights, and remedies made available to licensees under the motor vehicle industry licensing act. Repeals the definition of good faith. -- SB0035

Introduced by: Baker R, Green J, Chun Oakland S
Requires the director of health to convene a mental health and substance abuse parity working group. Requires the working group to review special reports, and updates to the special reports that provide an analysis of the Paul Wellstone and Peter Domenici mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act of 2008 and relevant interim final rules; review the provisions in the national health care reform laws and regulation that affect behavioral health care; determine the state's role and responsibilities in implementing the mental health parity and Addiction Equity Act of 2008; and examine and make recommendations regarding the addition or enhancement of various components of the State's mental health and substance abuse parity laws. Requires the legislative reference bureau to assist the working group in drafting any appropriate legislation. Report to the legislature. Working group to cease to exist on June 30, 2013 (sunset). -- SB0036 SD1

- SB0040 SD2 (SSCR 573) RELATING TO PSEUDOEPHEDRINE.
Introduced by: Baker R, Green J, Chun Oakland S, Fukunaga C
Amends provisions relating to schedule V to include pseudoephedrine or any drug containing pseudoephedrine under stimulants. Provides that no later than July 1, 2011, all drugs containing pseudoephedrine shall be subject to prescription requirements and all retail sellers of drugs containing pseudoephedrine shall remove these drugs from all public areas where over the counter drugs are available for sale. Amends provisions relating to prescriptions under the uniform controlled substances act. Prohibits pseudoephedrine to be dispensed without a written prescription. Repeals exceptions for any sale, transfer, furnishing, or receipt of any drug that contains pseudoephedrine or norpseudoephedrine that is lawfully sold, transferred, or furnished over the counter without a prescription. Repeals provisions relating to pseudoephedrine permit. Repeals provisions relating to unlawful transport of pseudoephedrine. Repeals provisions relating to sales of products, mixtures, or preparations containing pseudoephedrine; reporting requirement for wholesalers. -- SB0040 SD2

Introduced by: Espero W
Establishes provisions relating to annual corrections and program report. Requires the department of public safety to submit an annual corrections and program report that consolidates 1 report relating to mental health services at certain correctional facilities; relating to mental health services for committed persons; relating to gender responsive community based programs for women; relating to cognitive restructuring; relating to children of incarcerated persons; and relating to key performance indicators. Establishes provisions relating to performance indicator reporting. Requires the department of public safety to develop performance measures that accurately reflect progress to specific goals, including improving recidivism rates; decreasing prisoner assaults on correctional staff; reducing correctional staff turnover; and improving departmental efficiencies in staffing, budgeting, and data management and analysis and post the reports electronically on the department's internet website in a timely manner. Report to the legislature. -- SB0044 SD1

Amends provisions relating to civil service and exemptions. Repeals the exemption for 1st deputy sheriff, and 2nd deputy sheriff. -- SB0045

- SB0048 SD1 (SSCR 483) RELATING TO CORRECTIONS.
Introduced by: Espero W
Establishes provisions relating to transfer of inmates to other Hawaii correctional facilities. Allows the director of public safety to transfer a committed felon to any correctional facility located in this State, if the transfer is in the best interests of the State and the welfare of the committed felon will be best served by the transfer; provided that the director consider if the committed felon is currently engaged in rehabilitation or reentry program prior to the proposed transfer; if the committed felon is currently engaged in a rehabilitation or reentry program prior to the proposed transfer, whether the felon may continue with a similar program at the facility to which transfer is proposed; and whether other committed felons have volunteered to be transferred provided that felons volunteering for a transfer to be given preference for a transfer to achieve cost savings. Amends provisions relating to transfer of inmates to out of state institutions. Prohibits a committed felon to be transferred if that felon has 12 months or less to serve on a sentence before being eligible to be paroled. Allows the director to consider, prior to the transfer of a committed felon to any correctional institution located in another state, whether the committed felon is regularly participating in extended family leave visitations with the committed felon's child and whether the transfer would disrupt the visitations or allows the director to consider, among other things; whether the committed felon is enrolled in a vocational, educational, treatment, reentry, or other program that cannot reasonably be resumed at the correctional facility in another state; and whether other committed felons volunteering for a transfer to be given preference for a transfer to achieve cost savings. -- SB0048 SD1

Establishes provisions relating to correctional facility and community correctional center deaths; reporting. Requires the director of public safety to report to the senate president, speaker of the House of Representatives, and legislative committee chairs for public safety on correctional employee deaths or injuries sustained on the grounds of a correctional facility or center where Hawaii inmates reside and the death of any Hawaii inmate within 24 hours. Provides that if the cause of death has not been officially determined, requires the director to provide notice of the official cause of death within 48 hours of receipt of that information. Provides that the director shall have the discretion to withhold disclosure of the decedent's name pending notification of the death to the next of kin or if the decedent's identity is protected from disclosure by state or federal laws. -- SB0049 SD1

- SB0058 SD1 (SSCR 174) RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS.
Introduced by: Espero W
Establish provisions relating to transfers under the uniform controlled substance law. Allows a qualifying patient or primary caregiver who is registered under medical use of marijuana registration requirements to provide usable cannabis or any part of the cannabis plant to any other registered qualifying patients or any other registered primary caregiver; provided that no consideration is paid for the cannabis and that the recipient does not exceed the adequate supply amount. Increases adequate supply and replaces the term marijuana with cannabis. Redefines written certification to include that the form may not require that the signing physician be the qualifying patient's primary care physician and allows the form to request the address of the location where the cannabis is grown and the information be kept confidential and not appear on the registry card issued by the department. -- Amends

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provisions relating to registration requirements. Requires physicians who issue written certifications to qualifying patients to provide the name, address, patient identification number. Further provides that the information to include the physician's attestation that the qualifying patient has 1 of the debilitating medical conditions and not name or describe the particular condition. Prohibits a primary caregiver be responsible for the care of more than 3 qualifying patients at any given time. -- SB0058 SD1

Introduced by: Ihara L

Establishes provisions relating to anonymous filings. Allows a plaintiff to file a petition in civil actions as jane doe or john doe provided the court consider certain factors. -- Amends provisions relating to power to enjoin and temporarily restrain harassment. Allows plaintiff to petition in district court as jane doe or john doe, provided that the court finds that this is necessary to protect the privacy of the petitioner and will not unduly prejudice the prosecution or the defense. -- SB0077 SD1

SB0098 SD2 (SSCR 692)

RELATING TO WATER CARRIERS.

Introduced by: Baker R, Tsutsui S, Kouchi R, Green J, Chun Oakland S, Espero W

Establishes provisions relating to notice of hearing required under the Hawaii water carrier act. Requires the public utilities commission to provide reasonable notice whenever the commission conducts a public hearing on an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity. -- Requires notice to be provided at least 30 before the date fixed by the commission for the public hearing. Prohibits the commission to approve an application or otherwise grant authorization to an application to operate as a water carrier until the commission has given notice and held public hearings. Prohibits the commission to make finding of public convenience and necessity or issue an authorization, whether interim, permanent, or otherwise, to operate as a water carrier without specific findings supported by evidence in the record. Prohibits the commission to issue any certificate that is designated as interim or temporary or does not conform to the requirements except in response to an emergency situation. Requires the commission to post a link on the front page of the commission's website to a publicly accessible electronic version of each application for a certificate and to each order of the commission regarding posted applications, including the final decision and order and remain active for at least 30 days from the filing of the application or the issuance of the order or decision and order. -- SB0098 SD2

SB0099 SD2 (SSCR 756)

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

Introduced by: Baker R, Solomon M, English J, Kahele G, Tsutsui S, Kouchi R, Green J, Chun Oakland S

Establishes provisions relating to notice of hearing required under the Hawaii water carrier act. Requires the public utilities commission to provide reasonable notice whenever the commission conducts a public hearing on an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity. -- Amends provisions relating to public utilities commission; number, appointment of commissioners, qualifications; compensation; persons having interest in public utilities by adding establishment and composition of panel. Requires the commission to elect its chairperson from 1 of its members instead of being appointed by the governor. Requires the commission to establish 2 panels with membership consisting of 2 commissioners plus the chairperson. Further requires that 1 panel to be devoted to issues relating to energy and the private water and sewage utilities and the other panel to be devoted to issues relating to motor and water carrier transportation services, telecommunications, and warehousing of goods. Repealed on July 1, 2017 (sunset). -- Amends provisions relating to employment by changing it to executive officer; appointment of assistants. Requires the commission to employ staff to include an executive officer,

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administrative personnel, and other personnel necessary to carry out the duties of the commission. -- Amends provisions relating to certificates of public convenience and necessity. Provides that if the application does not meet the criteria established, it shall be denied and requires any certificate issued to specify the service to be rendered and any reasonable conditions and limitations to the exercise of the privileges granted by the certificate as the public convenience and necessity may require at the time of issuance of the certificate or at any later time as determined by the commission. Requires the commission to post a link on the front page of the commission's website to publicly accessible electronic version of each application for a certificate, each order of the commission regarding posted applications, and the commission's final decision and order. Prohibits the commission to approve an application for a certificate or otherwise grant authorization to an application to operate as a water carrier until the commission has given notice and held public hearings. Requires the commission to issue a certificate to any qualified applicant authorizing the whole or any part of the operations proposed in the application. Prohibits the commission to make finding of public convenience and necessity or issue an authorization, whether interim, permanent, or otherwise, to operate as a water carrier without specific finding supported by evidence in record indicates that the issuance of the certificate will diminish an existing water carrier's ability to realize its allowed rate of return or if the certificate would allow an applicant to serve only high margin or high profit ports or lines of service that are currently served by and existing carrier. -- Requires the public utilities commission to comprise 5 commissioners who reflect the requisite geographical and professional diversity by July 1, 2012 and allows the governor to nominate new commissioners as needed to meet the requirements or reduce the term of any commissioner as necessary. Initial and annual report to the legislature. Repealed on July 1, 2017 (sunset). Appropriation. (\$\$) -- SB0099 SD2

RELATING TO HEALTH.

Introduced by: Shimabukuro M, Kidani M, Tsutsui S

Establishes provisions relating to producers of hand pounded poi; exemption. Exempts a producer of hand pounded poi to process poi in a certified food processing establishment or obtain a permit from the department of health. Establishes provisions relating to producers of hand pounded poi; inspections. Provides that if the department receives a consumer complaint about the producer, the producer will be subject to food sampling and subsequent inspection of the producer's premises to determine if the producer's products are in violation. -- SB0101 SD1

RELATING TO UNIFORM REAL PROPERTY TRANSFER ON DEATH.

Introduced by: Shimabukuro M, Kidani M, Tsutsui S

Establishes provisions relating to uniform real property transfer on death act. Establishes that an individual may transfer property to 1 or more beneficiaries effective at the transferor's death by a transfer on death deed. Allows transfer on death deed to be revocable even if the deed or another instrument contains a contrary provision and it is nontestamentary. -- SB0105 SD2

SB0106 SD1 (SSCR 433)

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PENAL CODE.

Introduced by: Shimabukuro M, Tsutsui S

Amends provisions relating to multiple sentence of imprisonment. Requires the court, in determining whether the terms imposed to be ordered to run concurrently or consecutively, to consider the factors of any resentencing pursuant to this law of defendants who were sentenced prior to June 18, 2008, are not to be considered as a reopening of a final judgment; or impose any liability upon the State for sentencing errors.-- Amends Act 193, session laws of 2008, relating to multiple sentence of imprisonment, by making it apply to all terms of imprisonment imposed before, on, or after the effective date of this act. -- Requires the department of public safety, upon written request by an inmate serving multiple terms of imprisonment, to recalculate the inmate's term of imprisonment. -- SB0106 SD1

RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR VIOLATIONS INVOLVING MINORS.

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Amends provisions relating to prohibitions involving minors; penalty by adding immunity. Provides that any person ages 18 to 20 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Requires each pharmacy benefit management company to make information available to its enrollees a list of the names and locations of all affiliated providers; a description of the method of resolving complaints of covered persons; and notice that the pharmacy benefit management company is required to be register in the State by the commissioner and made available upon request or at least updated annually on the company's website. Requires a charitable organization, professional solicitor, or professional fundraising counsel that is required to be registered and that either has its principal place of business outside of the State or is organized under the laws of another state, and does not have a registered agent with the department of commerce and consumer affairs, is considered to have irrevocably appointed the department as its agent for the service of a summons, subpoena, or other process directed to the charitable organization, professional fundraising counsel, or professional solicitor, or to a director, officer, partner, or principal of the charitable

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organization, professional fundraising counsel, or professional solicitor in an investigation, action, or other proceeding. Amends provisions relating to administrative enforcement; cease and desist orders. Provides that whenever the attorney general finds that a charitable organization is soliciting contributions in violation, allows the attorney general in addition to the remedies prescribes, issue a cease and desist order to any such charitable organization. Allows any person aggrieved by an action of the attorney general to request a hearing to review that action 10 days after the attorney general has served that person with notice of the action. Amends provisions relating to annual financial reports; fiscal records and fees. Provides that if the charitable organization files an IRS Form 990 or 990EZ with the Internal Revenue Service, the annual report shall be the IRS Form 990 or 990EZ. In the case of a charitable organization that is not required to file an IRS Form 990 or 990EZ, the annual report shall contain information such information as the department shall prescribe. Allows a charitable organization that has obtained an extension of time to file the IRS Form 990 or 990EZ from the IRS to obtain an extension to file the report with the department by filing with the department a copy of the IRS's approved extension of time to file. Requires each charitable organization filing a report to pay a filing fee to the department based on the total amount of its gross revenues at the close of the calendar or fiscal year adopted by the charitable organization. Amends provisions relating to investigations; subpoenas; court orders. Provides that in any case where the attorney general has authority to institute a civil action or proceeding, allows the attorney general to instead accept an assurance of discontinuance of any act or practice that violates the law from any person engaged in or who has engaged in the act or practice. Allows the attorney general to refuse to register, revoke or suspend the registration of any charitable organization, professional fundraising counsel, or professional solicitor, or issue a cease and desist order. Provides that charitable organizations exempted from registration and financial disclosure requirements include educational institutions accredited by the Hawaii association of independent schools; the Hawaii council of private schools; the western association of schools and colleges; middle states association of schools and colleges; new England association of schools and colleges; north central association of schools and colleges; northwest association of schools and colleges and southern association of schools and colleges or the National Association for the Education of Young children. Further exempts any corporation established by an act of the US congress that is required by federal law to submit to congress annual reports, fully audited by the US Department of Defense, of its activities including itemized accounts of all receipts and expenditures; any agency of this State, another state, or the federal government; and any charitable organization that normally receives less than 25,000 dollars in contributions annually, if the organization does not employ or compensate a professional solicitor or professional fundraising counsel. -- SB1233 SD2

Defines additional compensation to include any other additional or extra payments, excluding regular compensation, to an employee or officer, including overtime, bonuses, lump sum salary supplements, allowances, and differentials, including differentials for stand by duty, temporary unusual work hazards, compression differentials, and temporary differentials, provided that it does not include 12 month differentials for employees of the department of education. Defines regular compensation to mean normal periodic payments of money for services performed, the right to which accrues on an hourly, daily, monthly, or annual basis; shortage differentials; and elective salary reduction contributions under sections 125, 403(b), and 457(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. -- SB1269 SD2

Requires every managed care plan to file with the commissioner, every rate, charge, classification, schedule, practice, or rule and every modification by an electronic copy or 2 printed copies and every filing to be accompanied by a 50 dollar fee payable to the commissioner and to be deposited in the commissioner's education and training fund. Amends provisions relating to the Hawaii hurricane relief fund. Repeals provisions that the formula to calculate the amount and period of the surcharge for each covered event and the procedures and methodology for payment of claims and other obligation of the fund to be provided in the plan of operation. Requires the surcharge to remain in effect until all claims and other obligations of the fund, including but not limited to include claims under fund policies of hurricane property insurance. Allows the funds to establish procedures for insurers to collect a surcharge from their customers who hold property or casualty policies. Requires the society to deposit with the commissioner 50 per cent of the minimum net worth either in cash or in securities approved by the commissioner; provided that the deposit shall be not less than 1 million dollars and not exceed 2 million dollars. Repeal provisions relating to approval; when deemed effective. Repeals provisions relating to benefits funds. -- SB1276 SD2

Requires the plan administrator to provide a written response within 7 days to any written inquiry made by the commissioner. Requires the response to adequately address the concerns stated in the communication. -- Establishes provisions related to records and reports. Requires the commissioner to preserve in permanent form records and reports of the commissioner's proceedings, hearings, investigations, and examinations. Requires that these filings be filed in the commissioner's office and be open to public inspection, except when records and reports on file shall be confidential by this law. Requires the commissioner to maintain the confidentiality of any documents or information received from the National Association of Insurance Commissioners, the federal government, insurance regulatory agencies of foreign countries, or insurance departments of other states, territories, and commonwealths that are confidential in the jurisdiction of origin and provides that the documents and records shall be confidential and privileged, shall not be made public, shall not be subject to subpoena or discovery, and shall not be admissible as evidence in any private civil action and neither the commissioner nor any other person who received documents, materials, or other information while acting under the authority of the commissioner shall be permitted or required to testify in any private civil action concerning any confidential documents, materials, or information. -- Amends the prepaid legal services law by changing it to the legal service plans. -- Amends provisions relating to the application for authority; authority issued or denied; plan termination. Requires that before conducting business, a plan, application for certificate of authority, file documentation, and fee be submitted to the commissioner for approval. Requires the commissioner to issue or deny a certificate of authority based on the plan meeting the requirements. Requires the plan administrator to notify the commissioner in writing if the plan is canceled. -- Amends provisions relating to accumulated funds, protection, violation. Requires the plan

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administrator to have the responsibilities of a trustee for all funds accumulated. Requires the plan administrator to obtain a ____ dollar bond. Provides penalties. -- Amends provisions relating to failure to comply; penalty. Allows the commissioner to deny, suspend, revoke, or refuse to approve the certificate of authority of any plan or any plan amendments. -- Amends provisions relating to insurance code fees. Repeals life settlement contract fees and adds legal service plan fees. -- SB1277 SD2

Requires an insurance producer or a representative of the insurer, where no insurance producer is involved at the time of sale to make a record of any recommendation; obtain a signed statement from the consumer documenting the customer's refusal to provide suitability information and obtain a signed statement from the consumer acknowledging that an annuity transaction is not recommended if a consumer decides to enter into an annuity transaction that is not based on the insurance producer's or insurer's recommendation. Requires an insurer to establish and maintain a supervision system that is reasonable designed to achieve the insurer's and its insurance producers' compliance. Changes provisions relating to mitigation of responsibility to compliance mitigation and penalties. Provides that if a violation occurs, either because of the action or inaction of the insurer or its insurance producer allows the commissioner to order a business entity, general agency, independent agency, or the insurance producer to take reasonably appropriate corrective action for any consumer harmed by the insurance or order appropriate penalties and sanctions. Establishes provisions relating to use of senior specific designations and professional designations. Prohibits the use of senior specific certifications or professional designation by an insurance producer. -- SB1278 SD1

Provides that gross premiums, less any return premiums, charged for the insurance allocable to other states, are subject to the taxes and fees of those other states. Provides at the time of filing the report requires the insured to pay the tax and fees of this State to the home state of the insured when this State is not the home state of the insured to the director of finance through the commissioner. Provides that a surplus lines broker is not required to make a due diligence search to determine whether the full amount or type of insurance can be obtained from admitted insurers when the broker is seeking to procure or place nonadmitted insurance for an exempt commercial purchaser. Allows a surplus lines broker to place surplus lines insurance only with insurers who are authorized to write that type of insurance in the insurer's domiciliary state. Requires each insured who in this State after June 30, 2011, procures, continues, or renews surplus lines insurance for which this State is the home state of the insured, other than lines procured through an insurance broker to file with the commissioner within 45 days of the end of each calendar quarter a verified statement of all surplus line insurance transacted during the calendar quarter. Provides that within 45 days after the end of each calendar quarter requires each surplus lines broker to pay to the director of finance, through the commissioner a premium tax on surplus lines insurance transacted by the broker for which this State is the home state of the insured. Allows the commissioner to enter into a cooperative agreement, reciprocal agreement, or compact with other states to facilitate and provide for the collection, allocation, and disbursement of premium taxes attributable to the placement of surplus lines insurance; provide for uniform methods of allocation and reporting among surplus lines

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insurance risk classifications; conform to the requirement of the federal Nonadmitted and Reinsurance Reform Act of 2010. Amends provisions relating to penalty for failure to file statement or remit tax. Changes annual report to quarterly reports to the commissioner. Requires the insurance commissioner to submit recommendations for legislation pertaining to and enabling the insurance commissioner to participate fully in the multistate cooperative agreement, interstate agreement, reciprocal agreement, or compact for the collection and distribution of surplus lines premium taxes and fees created pursuant the nonadmitted and Reinsurance Reform Act of 2010 to the 2012 legislature for adoption. -- SB1279 SD1

Repeals provisions that the formula to calculate the amount and period of the surcharge for each covered event and the procedures and methodology for payment of claims and other obligation of the fund to be provided in the plan of operation. Requires the surcharge to remain in effect until all claims and other obligations of the fund, including but not limited to include claims under fund policies of hurricane property insurance. Allows the funds to establish procedures for insurers to collect a surcharge from their customers who hold property or casualty policies. Requires the society to deposit with the commissioner 50 per cent of the minimum net worth either in cash or in securities approved by the commissioner; provided that the deposit shall be not less than 1 million dollars and not exceed 2 million dollars. Amends provisions relating to fees, taxes and deposits law. Changes workers' compensation claim to claim adjusters issuance fee. Repeals life settlement contract provider and broker license issuance fee. Adds legal service plan certificate of authority issuance fee. Adds fingerprinting for each criminal history record check and fingerprinting check, a fee to be established by the commissioner. Repeal 150 dollars per year for all services including extension of the license for a regularly licensed life settlement contract provider or broker. Requires an insurance producer or a representative of the insurer, where no insurance producer is involved at the time of sale to make a record of any recommendation; obtain a signed statement from the consumer documenting the customer's refusal to provide suitability information and obtain a signed statement from the consumer acknowledging that an annuity transaction is not recommended if a consumer decides to enter into an annuity transaction that is not based on the insurance producer's or insurer's recommendation. Requires an insurer to establish and maintain a supervision system that is reasonable designed to achieve the insurer's and its insurance producers' compliance. Changes provisions relating to mitigation of responsibility to compliance mitigation and penalties. Provides that if a violation occurs, either because of the action or inaction of the insurer or its insurance producer allows the commissioner to order a business entity, general agency, independent agency, or the insurance producer to take reasonably appropriate corrective action for any consumer harmed by the insurance or order appropriate penalties and sanctions. Establishes provisions relating to use of senior specific designations and professional designations. Prohibits the use of senior specific certifications or professional designation by a insurance producer. -- HB1051 HD2

Amends provisions relating to insurance independently procured; duty to report and pay tax. After June 30, 2011, requires each insured who in this State, procures, continues, or renews surplus lines insurance other than insurance procured through a surplus lines broker to within 45 days after the end of the calendar quarter in which the insurance was procured, continued or renewed to file a written report with the insurance commissioner. Provides that for insurance procured, continued, or renewed after June 30, 2011, when this State is the home state of the insured, the insured shall pay the tax and fees

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of this State and all other states to the director of finance, through the commissioner and when this State is not the home state of the insured, the insured shall pay the tax and fees of this state to be home state of the insured. Requires the board to review the specifications and determine whether the development is of sufficient worth and value to justify the extension of the lease; the estimated period of time to complete the improvements and expected date of completion of the improvements; and the minimum revised annual rent based upon the fair market value of the lands to be developed exceed a specified amount. Prohibits any lease extension until the board and the lessee, or the lessee and the developer, mutually agree to the terms and conditions of the written agreement. Prohibits construction to commence until the lessee, or the lessee and developer have filed with the board a good and sufficient bond or other financial guaranty satisfactory to the board. Requires extension of the lease to be based upon the substantial improvements made and to be no longer than 55 years. -- Requires that any extension of a lease granted pursuant to this law is to be effectuated, documented, and executed using the most current lease form and leasing practices and policies of the board.
