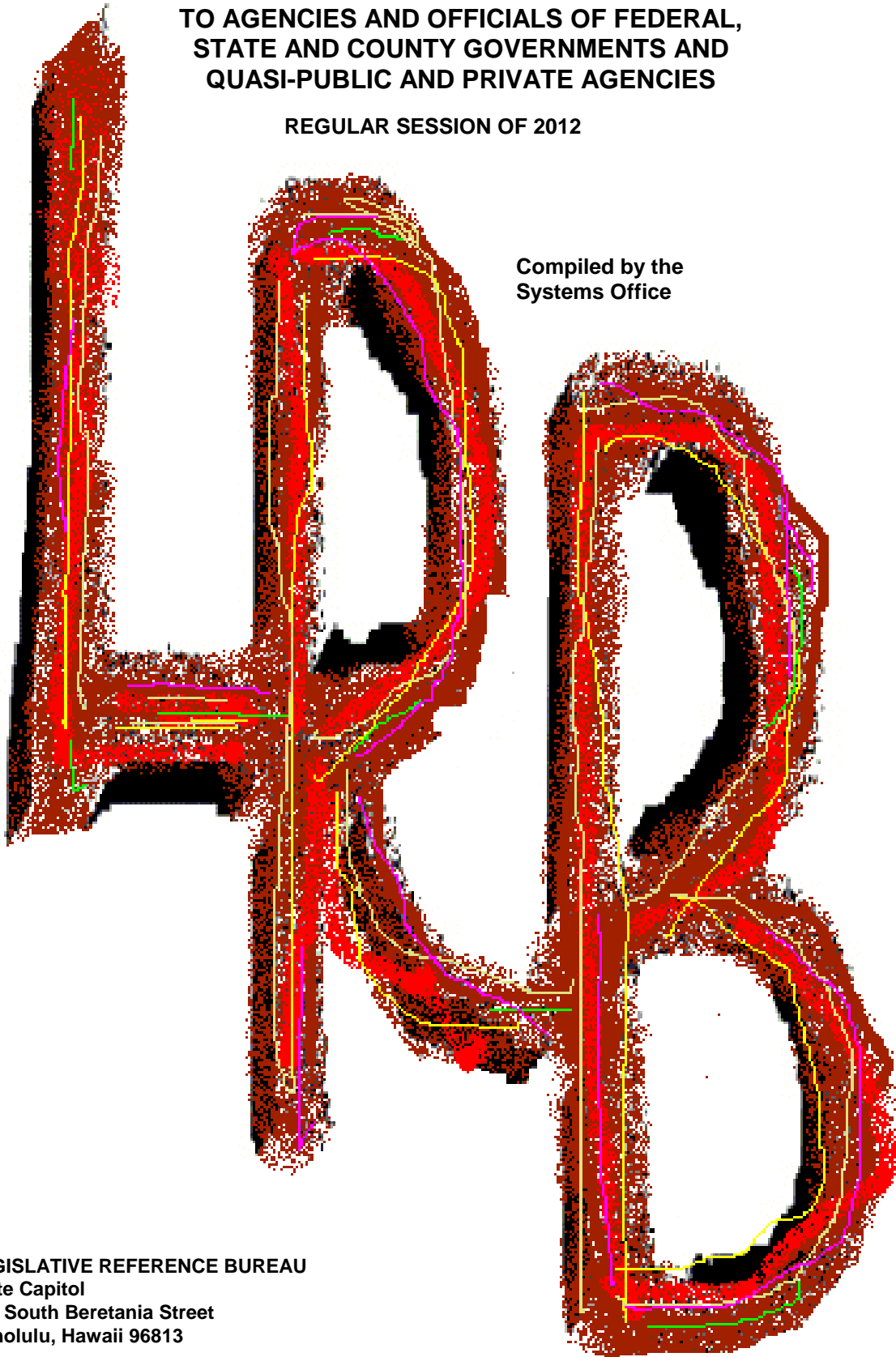

## FOREWORD

This publication sets forth all of the requests made by the Hawaii State Legislature during the Regular Session of 2012 to agencies and officials of the federal, state and county governments and of quasi-public and private agencies. These requests are contained in acts enacted by the Legislature or bills passed, but which have yet to be approved by the Governor. These acts or bills include specific requests for submission of information back to the Legislature, excluding annual and other reports requested on an indefinite basis. These requests are also contained in resolutions adopted by the Senate or House of Representatives or by the whole legislature. Dates by which reports and other responses are expected are indicated when specifically set by the Legislature. The names of the agencies involved in the conduct of a study or the execution of a request are underscored.

For the reader's convenience these legislative requests are also grouped together by agencies (see agency index); as well as by subject matter (see subject index).

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**ACT 2**

**SB 239, SD2, HD2, CD1**

UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII, JOHN A. BURNS SCHOOL OF MEDICINE, FINANCIAL PLAN. Requires the University of Hawaii shall submit a report detailing its financial plan to fund the operating expenses of the John A. Burns school of medicine including an itemized list of all means of funding the John A. Burns school of medicine's operating expense to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2013, 2014, and 2015.

**ACT 3**

**SB 809, SD1, HD1, CD1**

UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII PROJECTS FUNDED THROUGH REVENUE BONDS. Requires the University of Hawaii to notify the Legislature upon the issuance of the additional revenue bonds including a detailed listing and description of all projects to be funded through the revenue bonds authorized pursuant to this Act.

**ACT 63**

**SB 2774, SD2, HD1**

STATE AND COUNTY PUBLICATIONS, AVAILABILITY ON LINE. Requires the Chief Information Officer, with the assistance of the Office of Information Management and Technology and the Hawaii State Public Library System, and in consultation with the counties, to review the technology, personnel, training, fiscal, and other requirements necessary to implement a program through which state and county agencies would make all of their publications available in electronic format for online distribution.

Further requires the Officer to submit findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

**ACT 78**

**SB 2822, SD2, HD2**

ELECTRIC DEVICES, RECYCLING PROGRAM FOR. Establishes the Hawaii electric device recycling task force within the Department of Health to make recommendations for a workable recycling program for electric devices in Hawaii and keeping in mind the conditions and needs of the various islands.

Requires the task force to consist of the following members:

- (1) The Director of Health or the Director's designee, who shall serve as chairperson of the task force;

- (2) The program manager of the Department of Health's Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch;
- (3) The recycling coordinators of the counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii and the City and County of Honolulu;
- (4) Up to two representatives of the Consumer Electronics Association, to be designated by the Director;
- (5) A representative of the Consumer Electronics Retailers Council, which also includes manufacturers, to be designated by the Director;
- (6) Up to three representatives of major retailers that already conduct take-back programs for electric devices, to be designated by the Director;
- (7) Up to two representatives of major retailers that do not already conduct take-back programs for electric devices, to be designated by the Director;
- (8) Up to six representatives of the local recycling industry, to be designated by the Director;
- (9) Up to four representatives of the interstate and intrastate shipping or freight transportation industry, to be designated by the Director;
- (10) Up to two representatives of consumer or industrial technology manufacturers that have experience with recycling programs for electric devices, to be designated by the Director; and
- (11) Any other members that the Director chooses to designate.

Requires the Department to submit a report of the task force's findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

**ACT 101**

**SB 112, SD1, HD1, CD1**

**SPACEPORT LICENSE APPLICATION.** Requires the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to submit a report on the status of the application for the spaceport license to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

**SB 240, SD2, HD2, CD1**

**PHYSICIAN WORKFORCE, ASSESSMENT OF.** Requires the John A. Burns School of Medicine to submit a report of findings and recommendations detailing its assessment of the physician workforce to the Legislature, the State Health Planning and Development Agency, and the Hawaii Medical Board, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011 and each year thereafter. Repealed on June 30, 2017.

**SB 1276, SD2, HD2, CD1**

HEALTH PROGRAM IN HAWAII, ESTABLISHMENT OF. Requires the Insurance Division of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to prepare a comprehensive study on the feasibility of establishing a basic health program in Hawaii including the:

- (1) Short-term and long-term financial costs and benefits to the State;
- (2) Immediate and ongoing availability of federal funds to support the program and requirements for long-term sustainability;
- (3) Options for selecting providers for the program;
- (4) Effect of the program on relevant existing health care providers and health care organizations, programs, and agencies, including the Hawaii health connector;
- (5) Potential benefits to enrollees of the program compared to the potential drawbacks to these same individuals if a basic health program is not offered; and
- (6) Any other considerations that may impact the overall delivery of health care in Hawaii.

Further requires the Division to submit a report of its findings and recommendations including any proposed legislation to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

**SB 1382, SD2, HD1, CD1**

HIGHER EDUCATION ACT OF 1965, EXAMINATION OF. Requires the Auditor to examine the federal Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and federal regulations pursuant to that Act, and recommend the best available options to the State, including a regulatory framework submit a report of the analyses performed to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

**SB 2534, SD2, HD2**

SCHOOL FACILITIES SPECIAL FUND TO MEET TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY SCHOOL STANDARDS. Requires the Public Land Development Corporation to submit a report detailing the progress made with the school facilities special fund, including sites being considered for non-permanent disposition and the process the corporation is employing to select where the construction of new facilities and retrofitting of existing facilities to meet twenty-first century school standards will be done to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

**SB 2536, HD2, CD1**

CLEAN AND SOBER HOMES AND HALFWAY HOUSES. Requires the Director of Health, or the Director's designee, to chair and convene the clean and sober home and halfway house task force which includes:

- (1) The directors of each of the county planning departments or the directors' designees;
- (2) The Chair of the Hawaii Paroling Authority or the Chair's designee;
- (3) Homeless advocates, as determined by the Department of Human Services;
- (4) Representation from clean and sober homes and halfway houses, as determined by the Department of Health;
- (5) Legislative representatives in equal number from the Senate and House of Representatives, as determined by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- (6) Legal representatives, as determined by the Department of Health, to address issues such as discrimination, including the Attorney General or the Attorney General's designee; and
- (7) Others, as appropriate, as determined by the Director of Health.

Requires the task force to report on the scope and nature of the accountability plan for clean and sober homes and halfway houses, the process by which the houses will be monitored, the way in which concerns of the community members are balanced with the concerns of those requiring the support of the homes, and how the homes will be regulated short of direct governmental oversight including findings and recommendations of the task force and any proposed legislation that may be necessary to effectuate those recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2013.

**SB 2545, SD2, HD2, CD1**

EARLY LEARNING SYSTEM IMPLEMENTATION. Requires the Executive Office on Early Learning temporarily placed within the Office of the Governor to submit a report on the status of an implementation plan for the development of the early learning system including a timeline of the implementation plan and any projected funding needs, with a focus on targeting four year old children to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

**SB 2678, SD2, HD2, CD1**

HONOULIULI INTERNMENT-PRISONER OF WAR CAMP SITE, OAHU, EDUCATIONAL CENTER. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish a Honouliuli Park Site Project Advisory Group to develop recommendations to leverage county, state, federal, and private funding for an educational resource center at the Honouliuli site

Requires the Advisory Group to be composed of:



- (1) A member from the State Historic Preservation Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources;
- (2) A member from the University of Hawaii West Oahu;
- (3) A member from the Japanese American Citizens League-Honolulu Chapter;
- (4) A member from the Historic Hawaii Foundation;
- (5) A member from Monsanto;
- (6) A member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
- (7) A member appointed by the President of the Senate.

Requires the advisory group to report on recommendations to leverage county, state, federal, and private funding for an educational resource center at the Honouliuli site and the status of designating the Honouliuli internment-prisoner of war camp site and associated sites within Hawaii as part of the United States National Park Service to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

### **SB 2695, SD2, HD2, CD1**

LIVESTOCK FEED FEASIBILITY PROJECT. Requires the Department of Agriculture in collaboration with other research institutions to implement a livestock feed feasibility pilot project that shall:

- (1) Explore the viability of producing and processing livestock feed within the State through scientific research; and
- (2) To the extent feasible, produce and process livestock feed on land as determined by the Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture.

Further requires the Department to assess the implementation of the pilot project and report to the Legislature no later than December 31, 2014.

### **SB 2778, SD1, HD1, CD1**

CHILDHOOD OBESITY PREVENTION. Establishes a childhood obesity prevention task force to develop and recommend legislation related to the prevention of childhood obesity to be composed of:

- (1) The Director of Finance, or the Director's designee;
- (2) The Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, or the Director's designee;
- (3) The Superintendent of Education, or the Superintendent's designee;
- (4) The Director of Health, or the Director's designee;
- (5) The Director of Human Services, or the Director's designee;
- (6) The Director of Taxation, or the Director's designee;
- (7) A representative from the Department of the Attorney General;
- (8) A representative from the State Advisory Council on Early Childhood Education and Care;
- (9) A representative from the Board of Education;
- (10) A representative from the Department of the Attorney General;

- (11) A representative from the University of Hawaii's Department of Public Health Sciences;
- (12) A representative from the University of Hawaii's John A. Burns School of Medicine;
- (13) A representative from the American Heart Association;
- (14) A representative from the American Cancer Association;
- (15) A representative from the American Diabetes Association;
- (16) A representative from the Hawaii Association for the Education of Young Children;
- (17) A representative from the House of Representatives;
- (18) A representative from the Senate; and
- (19) A representative selected by the Governor.

Requires the task force to assemble accurate research, fiscal and demographic information, and justification to support policy development, and track outcomes and research other state, county, and organizational policy agendas and suggested best practices related to childhood obesity prevention policies and to report its findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

#### **SB 2780, SD1, HD2, CD1**

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROCUREMENTS. Requires the State Procurement Office and the Office of Information Management and Technology to submit monthly reports to the Legislature on the status of information technology procurements for authorized projects undertaken by the office of information management and technology to implement the State's information technology strategic plan.

Requires the Office to submit a report on the number of information technology procurements completed on an expedited basis, the results achieved in each technology project, as well as recommendations on the feasibility of establishing a new category for information technology procurements within the States procurement laws.

#### **SB 2790, SD1, HD1**

DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS CONSTRUCTION OF HOUSING PROJECTS. Requires the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to report on the status of the pilot project established under part I of Act 187, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2013, 2014, and 2015.

**SB 2804, SD2, HD2, CD1**

SAFE FACILITIES FOR THE HOMELESS. Requires the Department of Human Services, in conjunction with and with the advisement of the Hawaii Interagency Council on Homelessness, to submit a report on its findings and on the progress of the establishment of designated safe facilities in various locations throughout the State for homeless persons for overnight stays to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

(SSCR 2314, 2773, HSCR 1231-12, 1663-12, CCR 180-12)

**SB 2933, SD2, HD2, CD1**

WEST MAUI OCEAN RECREATION MANAGEMENT AREA. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish a temporary West Maui Ocean Recreation Management Area Advisory Committee that shall advise the Department on issues related to the uses and maintenance of state waters within the west Maui ocean recreation management area, particularly within the waters adjacent to Kaanapali on the island of Maui.

Requires the committee to consist of:

- (1) One swimming enthusiast;
- (2) One paddling enthusiast;
- (3) One surfing enthusiast;
- (4) One commercial boating enthusiast; and
- (5) One fishing enthusiast.

Further requires the Department to submit a report regarding the findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, of the temporary west Maui ocean recreation management area advisory committee, to the Legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013,

**SB 2947, SD2, HD2, CD1**

TAX CREDIT REPORTS. Requires the Department of Taxation to report on:

- (1) The resources and information needed to complete the reports required on tax credits;
- (2) An identification of the best means of providing information in an electronic format in the future; and
- (3) Recommendations for additional information that may be required for inclusion in the reports as the department upgrades its tax computer systems and associated enterprise resource planning implementation

to the Legislature no later than twenty days before December 31, 2012.

(SSCR 2090, 2608, HSCR 1076-12, 1649-12, CCR 176-12)

**SB 3006, SD2, HD2, CD1**

TIRES, LITTERING THE LANDSCAPE. Requires the Director of Health to convene a task force to study ways to prevent or control the problem of abandoned tires littering the landscape.

Further requires the task force administratively attached to the Department of Health and to be composed of:

- (1) The Director of Health, or the Director's designee;
- (2) The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, or the Chairperson's designee;
- (3) A representative of the City and County of Honolulu Department of Environmental Services;
- (4) A representative of the Honolulu Police Department;
- (5) Elected officials of affected communities, as determined by the Department of Health;
- (6) A representative from each of the neighborhood boards of affected communities, as determined by the Department of Health;
- (7) A representative of the tire recycling industry, to be selected by the Department of Health;
- (8) A representative of the vehicle recycling industry, to be selected by the Department of Health;
- (9) A representative of tire retailers, to be selected by the Department of Health;
- (10) A representative of automobile dealers, to be selected by the Department of Health;
- (11) A representative of Ka Wai Ola O Waianae; and
- (12) A representative of the Naval Facilities Engineering Command.

Requires the task force to report its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days before the convening of the Regular Session of 2014, and shall be dissolved on December 31, 2013.

**HB 1726, HD1, SD2, CD1**

ENERGY SYSTEMS DEVELOPMENT SPECIAL FUND AND BIOENERGY MASTER PLAN. Extends the report of the results of the evaluation of the projects and activities by the energy systems development special fund by the two-person panel of independent energy and environmental technical experts to be submitted to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the following Regular Session, to June 30, 2013.

(HSCR 18-12, 905-12, SSCR 2950, SSCR 3235, CCR 147-12)

**HB 1755, HD2, SD2, CD1**

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER USE IN VOTER REGISTRATION AND RECORD KEEPING. Requires the chief election officer and the clerk of each county to work collaboratively to study

the feasibility of using the last four digits of an individual's social security number, in lieu of using that number in its entirety in voter registration and record keeping, and submit a written report of the findings and recommendations and any suggested legislation to the Legislature no less than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

(HSCR 449-12, 773-12, SSCR 2883, 3347, CCR 141-12)

**HB 1879, HD2, SD1, CD1**

RESIDENTIAL PEST CONTROL OPERATORS, EXEMPTION FROM REQUIREMENTS OF THE ONE CALL CENTER. Requires the Public Utilities Commission to conduct an investigation assessing the risk of residential pest control application and to submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2014.

**HB 1943, HD2, SD2, CD1**

DETECTOR DOG PROGRAM. Requires the Department of Agriculture to submit a report on the status of its progress in implementing the detector-dog program to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

(HSCR 586-12, 753-12, SSCR 2928, 3248, CCR 137-12)

**HB 2012, HD1, SD1, CD1**

PART III, SECTION 14.2

NOXIOUS INVASIVE PEST PROGRAM. Requires the Department of Transportation to submit a report on federal fund expenditures for statewide noxious invasive pest program related expenses to the Legislature no later than November 1, 2013, and November 1, 2014.

PART III, SECTION 16.2

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH 5 YEAR FINANCIAL PLAN. Requires the Department of Health to prepare a five-year financial plan which incorporates any or all previous retooling, restructuring, or strategic plans into one all-inclusive document; provided further that the plan shall account for each year of the five year period beginning with the 2013 calendar year and shall include:

- (1) A detailed description of each agency of the department and program ID, including the program objective for each;
- (2) A detailed description of department-wide and agency specific goals of current reorganization efforts;
- (3) A cost-benefit analysis of any proposed personnel and/or funding transfer within the department;

- (4) A department-wide and agency specific expenditure plan including all means of financing for each of the five years;
- (5) Forecasted changes in the regulatory environment and the department's ability to respond to those changes, including potential funding impacts; and
- (6) Anticipated increases or decreases in demand for services, including anticipated impact to resource expenditures resulting from those changes and detailed forecasts in anticipated clientele numbers and corresponding funding needs by program ID.

Further requires that the five year plan shall be submitted to the Legislature no later than November 1, 2012.

### PART III, SECTION 18.2

STUDENT TRANSPORTATION. Requires the Department of Education to expend funds only if:

- (1) The Department conducts a comprehensive assessment of need for each student transportation route that considers ridership rates, socioeconomic background of riders, distances from homes to schools, student safety, and cost effectiveness;
- (2) Student transportation routes are provided based upon need;
- (3) The board of education approves of the expenditure of funds for each provided route; and
- (4) Student transportation routes not mandated by state or federal law are provided in all four counties.

Further requires the Department to prepare a report that includes:

- (1) Documentation of all assessments performed and actions taken related to this section;
- (2) Cost savings measures implemented and changes to the methods used to procure student transportation services for fiscal year 2012-2013; and
- (3) Planned cost savings measures, changes to the methods used to procure student transportation services, and a comprehensive plan for providing and paying for student transportation services for fiscal biennium 2013-2015, and submit the report to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

### PART III, SECTION 20

CHARTER SCHOOL FACILITY RELATED EXPENDITURES. Requires the Charter School Administrative Office to prepare a report that shall include a detailed breakout of actual facility-related expenditures for the last completed fiscal year for each charter school and the method of funding and an explanation of the methodology developed by the Office to distribute the funds and to submit the report to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2012.

### PART III, SECTION 23.3

JOHN A. BURNS SCHOOL OF MEDICINE, EXPENDITURES OF. Requires the John A. Burns School of Medicine to prepare an annual comprehensive report detailing all

expenditures of the school and submit the report to the Legislature no later than September 1 of 2012.

#### PART V, SECTION 52.3

ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING PROJECT. Requires the Department of Accounting and General Services to report on its progress in implementing phase 1 of the statewide enterprise resource planning project to apprise the legislature of recommendations of the available options for the statewide enterprise resource planning systems and other solutions that best meet the needs of the State of Hawaii at least twenty days prior to the Regular Session of 2013, and as of June 30, 2013.

#### PART VI, SECTION 66.1

RENTAL MOTOR VEHICLE CUSTOMER FACILITY REVENUE BOND FUNDS. Requires the Governor to submit a report of all uses of the authority to use the rental motor vehicle customer facility revenue bonds funds, for the previous twelve month period from December 1 to November 30, to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

#### PART VII, SECTION 128.1

SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME. Requires the Department of Human Services to prepare a report that shall includes:

- (1) The number of general assistance recipients who applied for supplemental security income;
- (2) The number of general assistance recipients who signed the interim assistance reimbursement agreement;
- (3) The number of interim assistance reimbursement agreements transmitted to the Social Security Administration;
- (4) The number of general assistance cases that were denied supplemental security income benefits;
- (5) The number of cases where the department of human services was not reimbursed due to the missing interim assistance reimbursement agreement;
- (6) The total amount of funds not reimbursed to the department of human services due to the missing interim assistance reimbursement agreement; and
- (7) The total number of overpayment claims established for the amount of funds not reimbursed.

Further requires that the report include actual data for fiscal year 2011-2012, actual and projected data for fiscal year 2012-2013, and be submitted to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

#### PART VII, SECTION 129.1

DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS HOMESTEAD SERVICES DIVISION, FINANCIAL AUDIT OF. Requires the State Auditor to submit a report of its findings and recommendations no later than October 1 2012.

PART VII, SECTION 131.1

SCHOOL SYSTEM FINANCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY. Requires the Department of Education to prepare a report on section 302A-1301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that includes:

- (1) Information and calculations for each fiscal year from fiscal year 2009-2010 to 2011-2012 on the amount and proportion of the department's operating budget that was expended for administrative costs and the amount and proportion of the department's operating budget that was expended by principals, by means of financing; and
- (2) The department's plan that will enable it to comply with the requirements of section 302A-1301(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, for fiscal year 2012-2013.

Further requires the Department to submit the report to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

PART VII, SECTION 131.2

NON-FACILITY PER-PUPIL GENERAL FUND AMOUNTS ALLOCATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND CHARTER SCHOOLS. Requires the Director of Finance to report to the Legislature, Governor, Department of Education, and charter schools within ten days of any transfer of funds made.

PART VII, SECTION 132.1

UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII'S REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE BACKLOG. Requires the University of Hawaii to prepare a plan to prevent growth in the University's repair and maintenance backlog, system wide and submit the plan to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

PART VII, SECTION 132.2

UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII REVENUE SOURCES. Requires the University of Hawaii to prepare a report on all of its revenue sources that covers actual and projected data for fiscal year 2012-2013 and projections for the subsequent six-year planning period and submit the report to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

PART VII, SECTION 133.1

JUSTICE REINVESTMENT INITIATIVE. Requires the Department of Public Safety to prepare a report on the justice reinvestment that includes to-date and projected data for the current fiscal year to fiscal year 2015-2016 and submit the report to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

PART VII, SECTION 133.2

PUBLIC EMPLOYEES OVERTIME USE. Requires every executive department and agency shall prepare a report on overtime use and for the Department of Budget and Finance to submit a compiled report and a statement documenting any actions taken in consideration of



the report to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013 regular session.

#### PART VII, SECTION 133.3

PUBLIC EMPLOYEES OVERTIME PAY. Requires every executive department and agency to prepare a report on overpayments and the Department of the Attorney General to prepare an additional report providing information on the status of all overpayments it has been referred and for the Department of Budget and Finance to review and compiled the report and submit the report to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013

#### PART VII, SECTION 134

WATERSHED INITIATIVE. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to submit a report detailing the expenditure plan for watershed related appropriations no later than September 1, 2012, to the Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

CONCUSSION EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM, DEVELOPMENT OF. Requires the Department of Education and the Hawaii High School Athletic Association to develop a concussion educational program that includes:

- (1) Educating students, parents, sports officials, school faculty, coaches, staff, and school administrators about the signs and symptoms of a concussion and the procedures to follow if a person displays any of the signs or symptoms of a concussion;
- (2) Annual educational sessions about the signs and symptoms of a concussion for

- coaches and athletic trainers;
- (3) The need for the mandatory removal of a student from the athletic activity that the student is participating in, if the student demonstrates any signs and symptoms of a concussion;
  - (4) The need for a concussed student's licensed health care provider to evaluate the student and determine whether the student is able to return to a particular athletic activity; and
  - (5) The monitoring of a student's return to physical activity by the school's certified athletic trainer, if an athletic trainer is employed by the school. This return to activity plan is to be based upon peer-review scientific evidence, such as that from the National Athletic Trainer Association or Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Further requires that an educational program be developed for every public and private school that is a member of the Hawaii High School Athletic Association on how to develop a school's concussion awareness plan and that every program shall require:

- (1) Annual concussion awareness training for coaches, administrators, faculty, staff, and sports officials, including:
  - (A) The signs and symptoms of a concussion;
  - (B) The need to obtain proper medical attention for a person suspected of having a concussion; and
  - (C) Information on the nature and risk of concussions, including the danger of continuing to play after sustaining a concussion and the proper method of allowing a student who has sustained a concussion to return to activity;
- (2) Annual concussion awareness education for parents and students who participate in a school's athletic team or programs or both. The parents and students shall sign a concussion information sheet that they have attended and received this concussion awareness education;
- (3) Immediate removal from a game, practice, or other activity of any student who exhibits signs, symptoms, or behaviors consistent with a concussion, such as loss of consciousness, headache, dizziness, confusion, or balance problems. The student shall not return to the activity until cleared to do so by a licensed health care provider; and
- (4) The student to obtain written clearance from a licensed health care provider prior to returning to academics and athletics, which:
  - (A) States that the student is capable of resuming participation in a particular sport;
  - (B) May require the student to follow a plan designed to aid the student to recover and resume participation in school and athletic activities that:
    - (i) Includes, as appropriate, periods of cognitive and physical rest while symptoms of a concussion persist; and
    - (ii) Reintroduces cognitive and physical demands on the student on a progressive basis to prevent the reemergence or worsening of symptoms of a concussion; and
  - (C) Requires that the student's return to physical activity be monitored by the school's certified athletic trainer, if an athletic trainer is employed by the school.

Requires the Department to report on the development and implementation of the concussion educational program to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the

convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

- (12) One or more mental health clubhouses;
- (13) The Hawaii Centers for Independent Living;
- (14) The Hawaii Disability Rights Center;
- (15) The National Federation of the Blind, Hawaii Chapter;
- (16) The Hawaii Association of the Blind;
- (17) The Aloha State Association of the Deaf;
- (18) Hawaii Families as Allies, Hawaii Youth Helping Youth;
- (19) Aloha Independent Living Hawaii;
- (20) Consumer Family and Youth Alliance; and
- (21) One or more representatives from each of the counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui.

Further requires the task force to submit a final report of its findings, program

recommendations, and proposed legislation, if any, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

- (15) An owner of 100 acres or less of land who sustainably harvests sandalwood; and
- (16) Dr. Randall S. Senock, Associate Professor for Geological and Environmental Sciences, California State University at Chico.

Requests the task force is requested to examine and make recommendations on the following issues:

- (1) Conservation of Hawaiian sandalwood, including but not limited to:
  - (A) Supporting the sustainable management and use of Hawaiian sandalwood resources throughout the State, including reforestation efforts;
  - (B) Providing incentives to local entrepreneurs to cultivate Hawaiian sandalwood species for reforestation programs or sustainable commercial operations;  
and
  - (C) Providing support for programs that ensure the sustainability of commercial operations for Hawaiian sandalwood resources in the State; and
- (2) Establishment of requirements for a permitting process for the commercial and noncommercial harvesting of Hawaiian sandalwood, including a sustainable forest management plan; and
- (3) Prohibition of the export of native Hawaiian seed banks.

Further requests the task force to conduct a thorough inventory of sandalwood throughout the State in order to fully understand the status and distribution of Hawaiian sandalwood and to report on its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

- (1) Restrict at any time the taking, harvesting, or possessing of opihi from off shore islets in the State, including those islands listed in the Atlas of Hawaii, 3rd Edition (1998), man-made jetties and breakwaters, fishery management areas, fisheries replenishment areas, natural area reserves, refuges, and marine life conservation districts established by the Division of Aquatic Resources of the Department of Land and Natural Resources;
- (2) Restrict at any time the taking, harvesting, or possessing of opihi from below the waterline of any coastal area or nearshore waters of the islands of the State;
- (3) Restrict during closed seasons the taking, harvesting, or possessing of opihi from above the waterline of the coastal areas or nearshore waters of the islands; provided that the closed seasons be determined jointly by the Division of Aquatic Resources and the Hawaii Institute of Marine Biology of the University of Hawaii;
- (4) Allow the Kahoolawe Island Reserve Commission to govern the taking, harvesting, and possessing of opihi in the Kahoolawe Island Reserve, including the islands of Puukoae and Aleale;
- (5) Recognize individuals who are exercising Native Hawaiian gathering rights and traditional practices as authorized by law, or as permitted by the Department pursuant to article XII, section 7, of the Hawaii State Constitution, by allowing these individuals to take, harvest, and possess opihi only for those purposes; and
- (6) Establish a five-year moratorium on the taking or harvesting of opihi from the coastal areas or nearshore areas of the island of Oahu.

Requests the Department to submit an annual report that includes:

- (1) Updates on the development, adoption, and implementation of rules pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (2) The effectiveness and enforcement of the rules adopted to replenish the opihi stocks;
- (3) Ongoing discussions and work with the Hawaii Institute of Marine Biology of the University of Hawaii regarding establishing open and closed seasons for the taking and harvesting of opihi from above the waterline of the coastal areas or nearshore waters of the islands, gathering and compiling baseline and subsequent annual data on opihi stocks, and efforts in replenishing the opihi stocks;
- (4) Annual data on opihi stocks, including baseline data to be submitted in the annual report to the Legislature prior to the Regular Session of 2013, and the efforts and any issues encountered in gathering and compiling such data; and

- (5) Recommendations and any proposed legislation to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013 and every regular session thereafter.

- (3) Developing and implementing a plan to correct deficiencies, including addressing the lack of capacity to meet demand, employing needed storm water diversion solutions, making necessary facilities improvements to improve water flow, addressing ongoing needs for debris minimization and removal, providing regular inspections, and implementing a mechanism to gather input from communities affected by flooding.

Resolves that the Department with cooperation from the City and County of Honolulu's Department of Facility Maintenance submit a report of its findings, recommendations,

including any proposed legislation, and actions taken to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013.

- (2) Additional Medicaid Program Integrity Provisions: Termination of providers from Medicaid (if terminated under Medicare, the Medicaid state plan, or Children's Health Insurance Program); termination of excluded providers identified via established federal databanks, i.e., Office of Inspector General List of Excluded Individuals/Entities; processes to maintain a central repository of program integrity targets along with processes to track providers who are under investigation; overpayments including prevention and recoupment; mandatory use of the national coding initiative; registration of billing agents, etc.; implementation of expanded data elements under the Medicaid Management Information System to detect fraud and abuse with corrective action plans; and additional edits and audits, including predictive modeling and analytic technologies; and
  - (3) Additional program integrity provisions: Means to prohibit false statements and representations.

Further requests the report to include the Department of Human Services Med QUEST Division's plans and processes to assure adequate federally mandated oversight of the contracted managed care health plans' integrity programs and verification of the beneficiary receipt of services claimed by managed care health plans via explanation of benefits forms or another approved method.
