SENATE BILLS WHICH PASSED THIRD READING

- SB0002 RELATING TO SIMULATED FIREARMS.
Introduced by: Hee C
Amends provisions relating to terroristic threatening in the 1st degree. A person commits the offense of terroristic threatening in the 1st degree if the person if the person commits terroristic threatening with the use of a dangerous instrument or a simulated firearm. Defines simulated firearm to mean any object that resembles a firearm or is used or brandished as a firearm. -- Amends provisions relating to robbery in the 1st degree. A person commits robbery in the 1st degree if the person is armed with a simulated firearm. -- SB0002

- SB0003 SD1 (SSCR 691) RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.
Introduced by: Hee C, Galuteria B
Amends provisions relating to the election of board members. Requires the board of trustees of the office of Hawaii affairs to be nominated at a primary election and elected at the general election. -- Amends the term of office; vacancies. Requires the term of office of members of the board to be 4 years beginning on the day of the general election at which they are elected, or if elected at a primary election, on the day of the general election immediately following the primary election at which they are elected. -- Amends provisions relating to board of trustees, office of Hawaiian affairs. Repeals the provisions relating to special elections held in conjunction with the general election. -- SB0003 SD1

- SB0004 RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.
Introduced by: Hee C
Amends provisions relating to the mandatory use of seat belts, when, penalty under the traffic violations law. Prohibits a person to operate a motor vehicle upon any public highway unless the person is restrained by a seat belt assembly and all passengers in the front or back seat of the motor vehicle are restrained by a seat belt assembly or are restrained pursuant to the child restraint law if under 8 years of age. -- SB0004

- SB0005 SD1 (SSCR 603) RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS.
Introduced by: Hee C
Establishes provisions relating to withdrawal of leased land; fair compensation. Requires that upon a withdrawal or taking of leased land that causes any portion of the land to become unusable for the specific use or uses for which it was leased, the rent is to be reduced in proportion to the value of the land withdrawn or made unusable, provided that if any permanent improvement made to or constructed upon the land by the lessee is destroyed or made unusable in the process of the withdrawal or taking, the proportionate value thereof shall be paid to the lessee based upon the unexpired term of the lease. Prohibits any land under cultivation to be withdrawn or taken until the crops are harvested, unless the board of land and natural resources pay the lessee the value of the crops. Requires that upon a withdrawal, any person with a long term lease is to be compensated for the present value of all permanent improvements in place at the time of the withdrawal that were legally made to or construed upon the land by the lessee of the leased land being withdrawn. Requires the board to pay to the lessee, in the case of tree crops, the residual value of the trees taken and, if there are unharvested crops, the value of the crops. Requires that in the case of breeding livestock that cannot be relocated or marketed for the breeding value, the board shall to pay to the lessee the difference between the appraised breeding value and the salvage value, including the cost of transportation to a market on the island on which the leased land is located. -- SB0005 SD1

- SB0006 SD1 (SSCR 495) RELATING TO ANIMAL CRUELTY.
Introduced by: Hee C
Establishes provisions relating to reporting of dog or cat captured or killed in snare or trap. Requires that the incident be reported to a county animal control officer and, upon request, shall be turned over to the animal control officer. -- Establishes provisions relating to cruelty to animals by trapping. Provides that a person commits the offense of cruelty to animals by trapping of the person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly uses, sets, or maintains steel jawed leg hold traps, or a snare, conibear, or foot or leg hold trap in an area zoned as

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residential or any other area where such trap is prohibited by law. Makes it a misdemeanor.

SB0008 SD1 (SSCR 24)

RELATING TO VETERINARY MEDICINE.
Introduced by: Hee C
Amends provisions relating to the licensing required under veterinarian medicine law. Prohibits the owner and the owner's employees from performing any surgical procedure, including but not limited to surgical birth, ear cropping, tail docking, dewclaw removal, and debarking without being licensed as a veterinarian. Makes it a class C felony. -- Amends provisions relating to cruelty to animals in the 1st degree. Exempts licensed veterinarians from being charged with cruelty to animals if they do cropping or docking as customarily practiced. -- SB0008 SD1

SB0009 SD1 (SSCR 497)

RELATING TO ANIMALS.
Introduced by: Hee C
Amends provisions relating to cruelty to animals in the 1st degree. Prohibits any person convicted of cruelty to animals in the 1st degree to possess, own, or reside with any pet animal for a minimum of 5 years from the date of conviction. -- Amends provisions relating to cruelty to animals in the 2nd degree. prohibits any person convicted of cruelty to animals in the 2nd degree to possess, own, or reside with any pet animal for a minimum of 1 year from the date of conviction. -- SB0009 SD1

SB0010 SD1 (SSCR 424)

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION.
Introduced by: Hee C
Amends provisions relating to the employment of attorneys. Allows the Hawaiian homes commission or the department of Hawaiian home lands to employ an attorney and to use the services of the attorney general as needed and when the interest of the State, the commission, and the department are aligned. Provides that legal fees owed to the independent counsel shall be paid by the State. Repeals the provision that the Hawaiian home lands trust individual claims review panel may employ an attorney. -- SB0010 SD1

SB0015 SD2 (SSCR 605)

RELATING TO ENERGY.
Introduced by: Gabbard M
Amends provisions relating to ethanol content by changing it to biofuel content requirement. Requires the director of the department of business, economic development, and tourism to require that each distributor who sells liquid fuels in the State for use in motor vehicles shall ensure that locally produced biofuels account for at least 5 per cent of the distributor's annual sales of liquid fuels for motor vehicles by volume; provided that for diesel fuel, no more than 5 per cent of locally produced biofuel shall be required. Repeals the requirement ethanol be the only biofuel. Defines biofuel to mean liquid or gaseous fuel produced from organic sources, such as biomass crops, agricultural residues, oil crops including but not limited to algae, canola, jatropha, palm, soybean, and sunflower; other agricultural crops, grease and waste cooking oil, food wastes, municipal solid wastes and industrial wastes, and produced animal residues and wastes; provided that the fuels shall meet the relevant ASTM International specification of latest issue. -- SB0015 SD2

SB0016 SD2 (SSCR 743)

RELATING TO ENERGY RESOURCES.
Introduced by: Gabbard M, Ruderman R, Chun Oakland S
Amends provisions relating to solar water heater system required for new single family residential construction. Prohibits a building permit to be issued for a duplex unless the appropriate county permitting agency approves a waiver. Requires a waiver to be submitted to the appropriate county permitting agency on an application prescribed by the county permitting agency instead of the energy resources coordinator. Requires each county council to establish procedures and standards by which its county permitting agency may approve, approve with conditions, or disapprove an application for a waiver, including deadlines for the county permitting agency to act on the application, provided that the county permitting agency

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shall approve, approve with conditions, or disapprove the application only in accordance with standards and procedures established by its county council, Allows each county permitting agency to adopt rules to impose and collect fees to cover the costs of processing applications for waivers. -- SB0016 SD2

SB0017 SD2 (SSCR 695)

RELATING TO FOSSIL FUELS.

Introduced by: Gabbard M

Amends the environmental response, energy, and food security tax. Provides that the tax shall be on each unit of liquid, gaseous, or solid fuel sold by a distributor to any retail dealer or end user of fossil fuel product other than a refiner. Exempts coal utilized by an independent power producer that provides firm capacity power to a public utility whereby the annual heat input from non fossil fuels of the firm capacity power generated by the independent power producer exceeds the annual heat input from fossil fuels and coal used to fulfill a signed power purchase agreement in effect as of June 30, 2013. Provides that the tax shall apply to coal used to fulfill any power purchase agreement extended, modified, or renewed after September 1, 2016, and shall not apply to a public utility until the conclusion of the public utility's next rate case. Provides an additional tax of 12 cents per thousand cubic feet of gaseous fuel, and 4 dollars per short ton of coal. Changes the amount deposited into the environmental response revolving fund, the amount deposited into the energy security special fund, the amount deposited into the energy systems development special fund, and the amount deposited into the agricultural development and food security special fund. Amends Act 253, session laws of 2007, as amended by Act 151, session laws of 2012, by repealing the sunset date. -- SB0017 SD2

SB0019 SD1 (SSCR 524)

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

Introduced by: Gabbard M, Ruderman R, Chun Oakland S

Amends provisions relating to definitions under public utilities commission law. Redefines public utility to not include any person who owns, controls, operates, or manages a renewable energy system that is located on such person's property, and provides, sell, or transmits the power generated from that renewable energy system to an electric utility or to a lessee or tenant or the person's property where the renewable energy system is located. Requires any disputes concerning the requirements of this provision to be resolved pursuant to the provisions of the lease agreement or residential landlord tenant code law. -- SB0019 SD1

SB0023 SD1 (SSCR 518)

RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST A SEAWATER AIR CONDITIONING PROJECT.

Introduced by: Gabbard M, Ihara L

Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Kaiuli Energy, LLC, in the planning, design, construction, equipping, and acquisition of land for a seawater air conditioning district cooling facility. Authorizes the issuance of refunding special purpose revenue bonds to refund the special purpose revenue bonds. (\$\$) -- SB0023 SD1

SB0030 SD1 (SSCR 606)

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

Introduced by: Hee C

Amends provisions relating to voluntary expenditure limits; filing affidavit. Requires the affidavit to state that the candidate knows the voluntary campaign expenditure limitations and for the candidate to file affidavit the no later than the time of filing nomination papers. Requires a candidate for prosecuting attorney, who voluntarily agrees to limit campaign expenditures to be the same as the amount for the offices of state senator, state representative, and county council member. -- SB0030 SD1

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

Introduced by: Hee C

Amends provisions relating to noncandidate committee reports. Requires the report to include the amount and date of each contribution received and each contribution made and the name

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and name and address of the candidate committee or noncandidate committee to which the contribution was made. Provides that the purpose of an independent expenditure shall include the name of the candidate who is supported or opposed by the expenditure, and whether the expenditure supports or opposes the candidate. -- Amends provisions relating to the time for noncandidate committees to file preliminary, final, and supplemental reports. Requires that supplemental reports be filed by January 31 of each year. -- SB0031

SB0032

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM ELECTRONIC LEGAL MATERIAL ACT.

Introduced by: Hee C

Establishes the uniform electronic legal material act. Provides that legal material in an electronic record that is authenticated by the official publisher is presumed to be an accurate copy of the legal material. Provides that legal material and the official publisher includes the Constitution of the State of Hawaii published by the revisor of statutes; the session laws of Hawaii published by the revisor of statutes; the Hawaii Revised Statutes published by the revisor of statutes; any administrative agency rules published by the office of the governor; a state supreme court decision published by the supreme court; or the state court rules published by the supreme court. -- SB0032

SB0041 SD1 (SSCR 564)

RELATING TO REAL ESTATE.

Introduced by: Baker R (BR)

Amends Act 326, session laws of 2012, which establishes provisions relating to local contact; relevant information; advertisements; transient accommodations. Redefines local contact to mean an individual or company contracted by the operator of the transient accommodation to serve as the on site contact for the operator, residing on the same island where the transient accommodation is located, whose name is required to be prominently posted in the transient accommodation and included in any transient accommodation contract or written rental agreement and who provides local point of contact services in the case of an emergency or natural disaster, including providing and receiving information, transmits to the operator of the transient accommodation on-site questions, concerns, or property issues that arise regarding the transient accommodation, or transmits the operator's responses, at the direction of the operator, to on site inquiries about the transient accommodation. Provides that any other services provided by a local contact may be subject to licensing requirements under the real estate brokers and salespersons law. -- SB0041 SD1

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

Introduced by: Chun Oakland S, Green J

Amends provisions relating to mental health, illness and addiction. Adds the definition for law enforcement officer and changes police to law enforcement officer. -- Allows advanced practice registered nurse to initiate an emergency hospital admission. -- SB0044 SD1

SB0046 SD2 (SSCR 775)

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Introduced by: Tokuda J, Baker R

Establishes the post secondary education authorization law. Established a post secondary education commission within the department of commerce and consumer affairs to establish procedures for and to grant or deny the authorization, reauthorization, and revocation of the authorization of private colleges, universities, seminaries, and religious training institutions. Establishes fees for authorization which shall be deposited into the post secondary education authorization special subaccount of the compliance resolution fund. -- Repeals the state post secondary education commission under the university of Hawaii. -- Requires the governor to appoint 5 interim commissioners without regard to public service laws and selection and terms of members of boards and commissions provisions. -- Commission to report to the legislature. -- Repeals the unaccredited degree granting institutions law. Appropriation to the subaccount and out of the subaccount for ____ full time (____ FTE) permanent positions. -- Requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs to contract for an implementation coordinator or team to assist with the implementation of this Act. Appropriation. Transfers all rights, powers, functions, and duties of the university of Hawaii with regard to the state post secondary education commission to the department. (\$) -- SB0046 SD2

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

Introduced by: Tokuda J

Amends provisions relating to the aerospace advisory committee. Repeals the requirement that the department of education have a representative on the advisory committee. -- Amends provisions relating to duties and responsibilities of the lead agency. Repeals the requirement that the department of education be on the list of state agencies with responsibilities relating to marine and coastal zone management. -- SB0048

SB0049 SD2 (SSCR 817)

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Introduced by: Tokuda J

Amends provisions relating the disclosures required under the uniform information practices act. Requires the department of education to make available for public inspection and duplication the name and compensation of complex area superintendents. -- Repeals requirement that the department of education provide employees breaks throughout the work day during which they may smoke at locations off campus. -- Repeals experience requirements for principals and vice principals. -- Provides that each school community council may allow for student representatives selected by the student council of the school at the elementary and middle school level. -- Changes the terms entered to enrolled and enter, entering, entrance to, be admitted to, and entry into to attend, attended, attendance. -- Requires the department to transfer moneys collected from income check off for deposit into the school level minor repairs and maintenance special fund to the 3R's school repair and maintenance fund. -- Amends provisions relating to employer inquiries into conviction record -- Repeals provisions relating to employees of the department of education and teacher trainees in any public school; criminal record checks, teachers; licenses and certificates, certificates; revocation, teaching without certificate or licenses; penalty, and student bias. -- SB0049 SD2

SB0054 SD1 (SSCR 76)

RELATING TO AGING.

Introduced by: Chun Oakland S

Amends provisions relating to policy advisory board for elder affairs by adding lifetime membership. Adds the department of human services as a member of the advisory board for elder affairs. Allows the board by a majority vote at a meeting called for the purpose and attended by a quorum, to recommend to the governor that the governor honor a non ex officio member by a lifetime appointment to the board. Provides that if the governor accepts the board's recommendation, requires the non ex officio member so honored to have all rights and privileges of a non ex officio member's lifetime. -- SB0054 SD1

SB0058 SD2 (SSCR 602)

RELATING TO LANGUAGE ACCESS.

Introduced by: Chun Oakland S

Requires the office of language access in collaboration with other state agencies to implement a multilingual website pilot project. Requires the project to explore the utility and feasibility of creating a multilingual website to improve language access to information provided online for limited English proficient person seeking information about government and government funded services in the State; and to the extent feasible, produce a multilingual website for use by the public for the top 12 limited English proficient population groups in the State. Multilingual website pilot project to cease to exist on June 30, 2016 (sunset). Report to the legislature. Amends provisions relating to office of language access; established. Requires the office of language access to administer a statewide language access resource center. Authorizes the executive director of the office to have the authority to hire personnel to staff the language access resource center and to administer it multilingual website. Appropriation out of the general fund to the department of health to establish a statewide language access resource center within the office of language access to allow state agencies and covered entities to provide interpretation and translation services to limited English proficient individual in accordance with Hawaii's language access laws. Appropriation out of the general fund to department of health to establish a multilingual website pilot project that enables limited English proficient individuals to get information about government services in their own

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language. (\$\$) -- SB0058 SD2

SB0059 SD1 (SSCR 663) RELATING TO FOSTER CARE SERVICES.
Introduced by: Chun Oakland S, Green J, Espero W
Appropriation to the department of human services to increase the monthly board rate for foster boarding home parents, group homes, and child caring institutions. Reports to the legislature. (\$\$) -- SB0059 SD1

SB0060 SD1 (SSCR 639) RELATING TO VICTIMS OF CRIMES.
Introduced by: Shimabukuro M
Amends provisions relating to basic bill of rights for victims and witnesses. Allows victims and surviving immediate family members of crime, upon written request, to be informed by the police or the prosecuting attorney of their rights to participate in restorative justice processes, in the event that the criminal case that harmed them does not result in criminal charges being brought against a person or entity, to allow the victim and any loved ones who accompany them to discuss and address how they were affected by the wrongful act that harmed them, and what might possibly be done to try and help repair the harm or make things right. Provides also that restorative justice processes include restorative dialogues, restorative conferences, restorative justice circles, restorative sessions, native Hawaiian reconciliation practices such as ho'oponopono (hoooponopono), or any type of restorative justice group process where victims meet individually or with their loved ones, with a trained restorative justice facilitator. -- SB0060 SD1

SB0061 SD1 (SSCR 640) RELATING TO JUVENILES.
Introduced by: Shimabukuro M
Amends provisions relating to informal adjustment law violators under the family court law. Provides that informal adjustment may include participation in a restorative justice program where with the child and the child's parents or guardian, along with other supporters of the child, may meet with the victim harmed by the child's law violation, along with the victim's supporters. -- SB0061 SD1

SB0066 SD1 (SSCR 641) RELATING TO THE CODE OF ETHICS.
Introduced by: Shimabukuro M
Amends provisions relating to requirements for disclosure. Requires the financial disclosure statements be public records and available for inspection and duplicating, including those for members of state boards or commissions that have official authority that includes approving, issuing, or renewing permits or licenses relating to land use or water use, and the regulation of public utilities. -- SB0066 SD1

SB0068 SD1 (SSCR 496) RELATING TO SENTENCING.
Introduced by: Shimabukuro M
Amends provisions relating to sentence of imprisonment for class B and C felonies; ordinary terms by adding discretionary terms. Provides that a person who has been convicted of a class B or class C felony for any offense may be sentenced to an indeterminate term of imprisonment. Requires the court to impose a term of imprisonment of 10 years or less for a class B felony and 5 years or less for a class C felony. Requires that the minimum length of imprisonment be determined by the Hawaii paroling authority. -- SB0068 SD1

SB0069 SD2 (SSCR 805) RELATING TO FIREARMS.
Introduced by: Espero W, Green J, Galuteria B, Baker R
Amends provisions relating to registration, mandatory, exceptions under the firearms, ammunition and dangerous weapons law. Requires every person registering a firearm to be fingerprinted and photographed by the police department of the county of registration;

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provided that where fingerprints and photographs are already on file with the department, this requirement may be waived. Requires the issuing authority to perform an inquiry on the person by using the national instant criminal background check system before any determination to register a firearm is made. Requires that no fee be charged for the registration of a firearm except for a fee chargeable by and payable to the registering county for persons registering a firearm in an amount equal to the fee actually charged by the Federal Bureau of Investigation to the registering police department for a fingerprint check in connection with the registration. -- Appropriation to the counties of city and county of Honolulu, Maui, Hawaii, and Kauai for the establishment of a gun buyback program. (\$\$) -- SB0069 SD2

SB0071 SD2 (SSCR 750)

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY PROGRAMS.

Introduced by: Espero W, Baker R

Appropriation to the department of public safety to contract with community based nonprofit organizations to provide education, mentoring, restorative circles, farming, artisan skills, cognitive behavioral therapy, and cultural healing services to inmates and former inmates who are under the custody and control of the department or the Hawaii paroling authority. (\$\$) -- SB0071 SD2

Allows permit exempt buildings to be nonresidential manufactured pre engineered and county pre approved commercial buildings and structures consisting of a total square footage greater no greater than 1,000 square feet but no more than 8,000 square feet; and 1 story wood framed or masonry buildings or structures with a structural span of less than 25 feet and a total square footage greater than 1,000 square feet but no more than 8,000 square feet constructed in accordance with county, national, or international prescriptive construction standards, including barns, greenhouses, farm production buildings, including aquaculture hatcheries and plant nurseries, storage building for farm equipment, plant, or animal supplies, or feed, or storage or processing building for crops. -- SB0586 SD1

Provides that for each solar energy property that is used to generate electricity and is 1 megawatt or larger in alternating current capacity the credit shall be ____ cents per kilowatt hour sold for the 1st 120 months of operation for solar energy properties of 1 megawatt or larger in alternating current capacity; provided that a taxpayer with an energy property of 1 megawatt or larger in alternating current capacity and can show evidence that the taxpayer either has a signed power purchase agreement, had been in negotiations with a utility for a power purchase agreement, has a utility conducting an interconnection requirement study, or is in the feed in tariff active queue, on or before December 31, 2012, shall get ____ cents per kilowatt hour sold for the 1st 120 months of operation. Provides that for each wind energy property that is less than 1 megawatt in output and is not part of a larger wind energy property the credit shall be 20 per cent of the basis or ____ dollars, whichever is less. -- Requires the department of taxation and the department of business, economic development and tourism to collaborate to issue a joint annual report to the legislature. -- Requires the department of business, economic development, and tourism to study the costs and benefits of the tax credit and report to the legislature. -- SB0623 SD2

Increases the fidelity bond from 25,000 dollars to 100,000 dollars and the deductible from 5,000 dollars to 10,000 dollars; or allows the licensed escrow depository to deposit an equivalent amount of cash or other security device. -- Amends provisions relating to errors and omissions insurance by changing deposit to other security devices. -- Amends provisions relating to fees. Requires each money transmitter to pay initial and renewal fees. Requires that all fees, administrative penalties, and other charges be deposited into the compliance resolution fund. Changes the late filing fees, name change fee, and change in control of a license fee. -- Amends provisions relating to change control of a license. Requires the applicant to include the history of the

Provides that for mortgage loan originator companies headquartered out of state, a branch office may be its principal place of business. Redefines licensee to include a mortgage service company and excludes nonprofit organization. Redefines mortgage loan originator to include any individual who offers or negotiates the terms of a residential mortgage loan secured by a dwelling that served as the individual's residence, including a vacation home, or inherited property that served as the deceased's dwelling, provided that the individual does not act as a mortgage loan originator or provide financing for such sales more than 3 times in a calendar year. Redefines mortgage servicer company to add that employs 1 or more individuals who conduct mortgage loan origination activity. Provides that and individual is presumed to control a mortgage loan originator company or a mortgage servicer company if that individual is a director, general partner, managing member, or executive officer who directly or indirectly has the right to vote 10 per cent or more of a class of voting security or has the power to sell or direct the sale of 10 per cent or more of a class of voting securities of that mortgage loan originator company or mortgage servicer company. Adds that an applicant for licensure as a mortgage loan originator must complete pre licensing education of 3 hours of state law rules and has 12 months upon completion of the pre licensing education to submit an application for licensure. Requires a mortgage loan originator company that maintains its headquarters in this State to designate a qualified individual who is physically present in the principal place of business office as its branch manager to oversee and manage that principal place of business office. Increases fees and establishes new fees on mortgage loan originator, mortgage loan originator company, mortgage servicer company. -- SB1069 SD2

Allows a bank to transfer the real property to an operating subsidiary of the bank provided the bank's investment in such operating subsidiary shall not exceed 15 per cent of the bank's tier 1 capital. Authorizes a financial services loan company to charge to a borrower a below minimum draft fee of 10 dollars per draft, for the processing costs involved on a draft written below the minimum amount established on an open ended loan. Establishes annual fees on every Hawaii financial institution and penalty fines. Repeals provisions relating to annual license fee. -- Establishes provisions relating to Hawaii financial institution; fees; penalty. Requires a financial institution or financial institution applicants to pay fees and to be repealed on January 1, 2014 (sunset). -- SB1071 SD2

Adds whether the insurer has made adequate provision, according to accepted actuarial standards of practice. Replaces the term company's with insurer's. Adds whether the insurer's operating loss in the last 12 month period or any shorter period of time, excluding net capital gain, is greater than 20 per cent of the insurer's remaining surplus and replaces the terms affiliate, subsidiary to a reinsurer, obligor, or any entity within the insurer's insurance holding company system and which in the opinion of the commissioner may affect the solvency of the insurer. Adds any other finding determined by the commissioner to be hazardous to the insurer's policyholders, creditors, or the general public. Adds including disallowance for the purposes of making a determination of an insurer's financial condition by the commissioner and consistent with the National Association of Insurance commissioners accounting practices and procedures manual, state laws, and rules. -- Amends provisions relating to personal lines insurance. Requires the petition to include a nonrefundable application fee. -- SB1072 SD2

Allows a physical therapist to use support or auxiliary personnel, including licensed physical therapist assistants, to assist the physical therapist in the practice of physical therapy; provided that such personnel shall perform only duties prescribed by the board of physical therapy and perform these duties under the supervision and direction of a physical therapist. Defines a physical therapist assistant to mean a person who is licensed as a physical therapist in the State and assists the physical therapist in selected components of treatment or intervention. Requires that a physical therapist assistant be licensed before using the title,

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initials or other words that imply the person is a physical therapist assistant. Prohibits a person from practicing as a physical therapist assistant if the person is not licensed as a physical therapist assistant. Prohibits a person from claiming to be a physical therapist assistant when they are acting within the scope of a license issued under another law. Allows physical therapist assistant to participate in activities that are conducted as part of the educational program and are under the guidance and direct supervision of a licensed physical therapist. Allows a person licensed as a physical therapist or as a physical therapist assistant in another state or foreign country to practice physical therapy in this State if the person is part of a sponsored educational demonstration or instructional program. Allows physical therapists to act as an athletic trainer. Allows a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant to practice in the US Armed Services, the US Public Health Services, or Veterans Administration without state licensure, provided they meet federal regulations and provided further that they will be required to be licensed if they practice beyond the scope of their federal employment. Allows a physical therapist licensed in another state in the US or a country to engage in the practice of physical therapy for up to 60 days if that person is contracted to provide physical therapy to individuals affiliated with or employed by established athletic teams, athletic organizations, or performing arts companies that temporarily practice, compete, or perform in the State. Repeals the requirement that 1 member of the board of physical therapy be a physician, osteopathic physician, or surgeon, and adds that 1 member shall be a physical therapist assistant, who possesses a valid permanent license as a physical therapist assistant and has 3 years of experience. Appropriation to implement the licensure of physical therapist assistants. (\$\$) -- SB1074 SD2

RELATING TO PHYSICAL THERAPY.

Requires the physical therapist take the continuing competence units from a provider or agency approved by the board. Allows for exemptions, including due to illness and serving in the military. Allows a licensee to apply for inactive status. To reactivate the license, the licensee must obtain the required continuing competence units. Requires the licensee to keep and maintain records showing that each unit has been completed. -- Amends provisions related to biennial renewal; failure to renew. Requires a licensee to provide proof of completing the required continuing competence units before a forfeited license may be restored. -- SB1075

RELATING TO THE USE OF THE DOCTOR OF ACUPUNCTURE TITLE.

Allows a licensee who has been approved by the board of acupuncture to use the title Doctor of Acupuncture or designation D.Ac., after the licensee's name, or the term Doctor or prefix Dr. provided that the word Acupuncturist immediately follows the licensee's name if the term Doctor, or the prefix Dr. is used alone. Requires the licensee to furnish satisfactory proof to the board that the licensee has been awarded an earned doctoral degree in acupuncture (traditional oriental medicine). Requires that if the licensee graduated from a US institute, school, or college, the US institute, school or college must be accredited or recognized as a candidate for accreditation by a regional or national accrediting body that is recognized by the US Department of Education for the accreditation or pre accreditation (candidacy) of professional post graduate doctoral programs in acupuncture and oriental medicine. 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instrumentality are or shall be applicable to the new entity, unless the new entity is a municipal facility; require a non public entity, the private entity to be subject to hospital sustainability fee and participate in the hospital sustainability program special fund on the same basis as other private hospitals; exempts each new entity and private entity from paying any state taxes on any operating support subsidies and funds for capital improvements received by either or both of them and any taxes imposed with respect to amount received in connection with the transactions comprising the transition to non public status or in connection with any other transactions between or among any 2 or more of the State, the corporation, the regional systems, the new entity, and the private entity; exempts employees of the new entity from civil service law, Hawaii employer union health benefits trust fund; pension and retirement systems law, collective bargaining in public employment law unless the new entity is a municipal facility; prohibits director, or other member of the governing body regardless of title, officer; employee; or other agent of a private entity to be a director or other member, regardless of title, of the governing board of a new entity and any transaction between a new entity and a private entity, and any purchase of goods and services by or on behalf of the new entity or the private entity, to be exempt from concession of public property law, expenditure of public money and public contracts law and Hawaii public procurement code. -- SB1306 SD2

Requires the county to hold a public hearing if the authority determines that the proposed geothermal resources development is not an expressly permitted use to the county general plan and zoning ordinances. Allows any party who submits a written comments at the public hearing to have standing to request mediation. Requires the county to appoint a mediator.

Requires the county authority to issue a final decision no later than 6 months after receipt of an application. Requires the county to issue a permit if the county finds that the geothermal resources development meets requirements. Allows the county's decision to be appealed to the intermediate appellate court for final decision. -- Amends provisions relating to permits and site plan approvals. Provides that any application for a geothermal resources development permit must meet certain requirements. -- Amends provisions relating to districting and classification of lands. Provides that for each solar energy property that is used to generate electricity and is 1 megawatt or larger in alternating current capacity for solar energy property that is not competitively bid solar energy property, and which is placed in service after December 31, 2012, the credit for the 1st 10 years shall be 8 cents multiplied by the number of kilowatt hours produced by the solar energy property and sold by the taxpayer to an unrelated entity during the taxable year, or used on site to offset the site's demand for electricity or for competitively bid solar energy property placed in service after December 31, 2012, the credit for the 1st 10 years the solar energy property is in service shall be 4 cents multiplied by the number of kilowatt hours produced by the solar energy property and sold by the taxpayer to an unrelated entity during the taxable year, or used on site to offset the site's demand for electricity or for each wind energy property that is less than 1 megawatt in output and is not part of a larger wind energy property the credit shall be 20 per cent of the basis or 500,000 dollars, whichever is less. -- Requires the department of taxation and the department of business, economic development to collaborate to issue a joint annual report to the legislature. -- Requires the department of business, economic development, and tourism to study the costs and benefits of the tax credit and report to the legislature. -- HB0497 HD3

Prohibits an owner or lessee from being eligible to recover from the contractors recovery fund. Allows a petition to be filed in the county in which the young adult resides when the petition is filed. Provides that if a young adult is no longer under jurisdiction of child protective act, but chooses to participate in the young adult voluntary foster care program and meets the eligibility criteria, requires the department of human services and the young adult to enter into a voluntary care agreement and other conditions. Requires the department to file within 30 days after the voluntary care agreement is signed with the court in the county where the young adult resides. Provides that the department or any of its employees who provide services shall not be liable to a 3rd person for any acts of the young adult; and for injury to the young adult resulting from the negligence or act of a 3rd person providing services or housing to the young adult. Requires the department to report to the court developed in collaboration with the young adult 7 days prior to the review date and a copy provided to the young adult. Excludes general public from proceedings. Allows the family court to appoint an attorney sua sponte or at the request of any party to represent a young adult who is eligible. Requires a period judicial review to occur not less than once every 180 days after the signing of the voluntary care agreement and may be by court hearing or court review. Establishes termination and reestablishing jurisdiction. -- HB0873 HD2

Require the director to attempt to coordinate with agencies responsible for soil conservation plans and storm water management plans to make the forms as identical as reasonably feasible consistent with the department's duty to prevent, control, and abate water pollution in the State. Requires the director to approve a management plan for a term not to exceed 5 years; if the director determines that it will be in the public interest may be subject the management plan to any reasonable conditions that the director may prescribe. Requires the director to ensure that the public receives notice of each application for a management plan approval; allows the director to hold a public hearing before ruling on an application to control water pollution if the director determines the public hearing to be in the public interest; requires the director to establish an outreach program to provide landowners and owners of individual waste water systems with assistance in compliance and guidance on the management plan application process and the requirements, and education on nonpoint source pollution and its prevention, sewer connections, and upgrades. Establishes provisions relating to enforcement. Provides that no penalties may be imposed until at least 1 year has transpired from the date of service of the notice required and efforts at achieving voluntary compliance have not been successful. Establishes injunctive and other relief and appeal process and fees. Requires reports submitted to the department on discharge of waste to be made available for public inspection during established office hours unless the reports contain information of a confidential nature concerning proprietary processes or methods of manufacture. Allows the director to consult with and advise any person engaged or intending to be engaged in any business or undertaking whose waste, sewage, or drainage is polluting or may tend to pollute state waters; and person intending to alter or to extend any system of drainage, sewage, or water supply. Requires each facility to distribute at least annually to all staff and providers with admitting privileges, a copy of its written policies prohibiting non medically indicated induction of newborn deliveries prior to 37 weeks of gestation. Requires the department to produce and distribute factual and scientific educational information addressing infant mortality, including pre term birth to all facilities. Requires each facility to provide to the expectant mother upon admission factual and scientific educational material, including those produced and distributed by the department regarding infant mortality and pre term birth. Establishes provisions relating to reporting requirement; health care providers. Requires each licensed birthing facility to report to the department information concerning pre term birth and other reports contain at a minimum for each reporting period. Appropriation to the department of health to fund epidemiological and planning activities related to infant mortality; collect and analyze Hawaii specific infant mortality data; and identify social determinants of health as they relate to infant mortality. -- HB0909 HD2

Requires that for any defendant charged with a petty misdemeanor, misdemeanor, or violation and granted conditional release, the 1 year term of conditional release shall be tolled during any period of hospitalization ordered pursuant to this law, and in the case of a motion to revoke conditional release, from the filing date of the motion to the date of its determination by the court. -- Provides that if the person's conditional release is revoked, the period of conditional release is terminated and if the person who was charged with a petty misdemeanor, misdemeanor, or violation is placed on conditional release subsequently, the period of conditional release shall be no longer than 1 year. Requires the use of seed money be limited to expenditures necessary to determine whether sufficient support exists for a candidate to run for office as a publicly funded candidate. Requires candidates seeking certification for public financing for the office of state senator to submit an application for certification that contains at least 400 printed qualifying names with addresses and signatures, of which at least 350 will be accompanied by a qualifying contribution of 5 dollars in the same

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name. Requires candidates seeking certification for public financing for the office of state representative to submit an application for certification that contains at least 200 printed qualifying names with addresses and signatures, of which at least 250 will be accompanied by a qualifying contribution of 100 dollars in the same name. Requires the campaign spending commission, in coordination with the clerk for the county that includes the district from which election is sought, to provide verification. Requires the commission to issue a decision to certify or deny certification of a candidate as a publicly funded candidate. Establishes the criteria for the amount of public funding of senators and state representatives. Prohibits a candidate from accepting contributions from the time of certification for public funding to the end of the general election campaign period. Provides penalties for violations. Requires the certified candidate and the certified candidate's committee to furnish the commission campaign records, including all records of seed money contributions, qualifying contributions and expenditure. Requires the certified candidate to comply with all requirements through the general election campaign period. Requires that public funds be used only for the purpose of defraying expenses directly related to the certified candidate's campaign during the election campaign period for which the public funds are allocated. Requires all public funds and seed money received by a certified candidate be deposited into a depository institution and accessed through use of debit cards and bank checks. Funds distributed to candidates come from the Hawaii election campaign fund. Requires any candidate who knowingly seeks or receives public funding to fraudulently qualify for or receive public funding to have the candidate's certification for public funding revoked and be subject to fines and penalties. Requires the commission to create and publish all forms and receipts required as well as a candidate guide. Requires the commission to determine whether there is a minimum amount of dollars in the fund to certify candidates during the election and provide funding for comprehensive public funding for elections. -- Amends provisions relating to voluntary expenditure limits; filing affidavit. Repeals the expenditure limit for the office of the governor and the office of lieutenant governor. -- Amends provisions relating to the maximum amount of public funds available to candidate. Repeals the provisions for governor and lieutenant governor. -- Amends provisions relating to minimum qualifying contribution amounts; qualifying contribution statement.
